Principal's Message

During this time when we celebrate our sixty year legacy, it is fitting that we recognize that the success of All Saints would not be possible without the commitment of parents who have sacrificed to provide their children with the gift of a Catholic education. Additionally, they have provided strong and steady support through their generous sharing of time and talents.

The long-standing mission of the PTO has been the primary vehicle through which the energy and enthusiasm of the parent community has been organized and directed toward two goals: fundraising and community-building. Our school and community are the richer thanks to the dedication of many over the course of so many years.

One of the signature fundraising events for the past several decades has been the annual auction. Originally a harvest-themed gathering in the gym, it grew into a major, upscale event that was held at a variety of locations in northern Virginia before more recently returning to the Parish Activities Center. Through the years it has evolved and changed in accordance with the interests of the community, evolving from a grass-roots effort to a black-tie style event and finally the more recent approach of a casino night. At each moment in time, the auction has provided an opportunity for our community to gather in celebration of our school and to generate additional funds in support of our mission.

Mindful of the tremendous investment required by our PTO volunteers to host this annual event and having observed the long-term trends of this fundraising initiative, I believe that this is the moment for us to reassess our approach.

It remains a possibility that it may return in the future, maybe as a bi-annual event – or perhaps there is something entirely new for us on the horizon.
