

Summer Learning Program 2018

All Saints Catholic School

Grades K-2

During the summer students should spend a total of 15 minutes each day completing one of the following activities.

Reading

Reading A to Z and record in the reading log

Summer Book (www.summerbookcompany.com) activities

Math

Use the websites and record in the math log

These activities will be due the first week of school and a special treat will be waiting for students when they submit their work.

Grades 3-5

Reading

Students will read two books that correspond with their *Accelerated Reader* level (3rd Grade) or Lexile score on Scantron (Grades 4-5) and complete *Accelerated Reader* quizzes when returning in the new academic year.

Math

Students will complete two leveled math projects or a review packet as assigned by the teacher as a reinforcement of skills previously learned. Details regarding the assignments will be included in packets to be provided to the students. The work will be due the first week of school and will count as a classwork/participation grade. In addition, students should work toward mastery of their math facts. It is highly recommended that they practice with flashcards every day in order to gain this level of competency.

Both the math and reading assignments will be due at the end of the first week of school.

Grades 6-8

Reading

Middle school students are required to read two works of literature over the summer, one fiction and one non-fiction work.

In addition to reading the work, students should take notes on the following for the fictional book: characters, setting, plot, resolution, internal or external conflict, summary, questions, and predictions. For the nonfiction book they should record the following information: summary, predictions, asking questions, and writing down two significant quotations and explaining them. The

notes may be either typed or handwritten. Students may choose to write their notes in a notebook or small journal if they prefer but must include the following details in the heading:

Title/Author
Genre of Literature

When students return to school in August, they will complete a multiple choice exam demonstrating their comprehension of both the fiction and nonfiction works.
