Principal's Message

This week I wish to congratulate our 2nd grade students who received their First Communion on Saturday. It was a great privilege to witness the children receiving Jesus in the Eucharist for the first time. Thank you, Mrs. Cummings and Mrs. Pryor, for the wonderful formation that you provided our students in preparation for this Sacrament. Let us continue to remember our second grade students in our prayers, most especially those who will be receiving their First Communion on Saturday.

Thank you to those who responded to the recent survey regarding the question of whether All Saints Catholic School should continue to follow Prince William County Public Schools or initiate a policy change whereby the school would follow the decisions of Manassas City Public Schools regarding schedule changes due to inclement weather.

The participation rate within the community was very high with more than two hundred parents, faculty and staff completing the survey. Many respondents shared specific insights as to how inclement weather and the related schedule changes impact their family.

In summary, 60% of respondents indicated a preference for All Saints to follow the decisions of Manassas City Public Schools with 40% favoring Prince William County. While this response would seem to indicate that we might be better served by making a policy change by which we would follow Manassas City Public Schools, the narrative responses underscored the challenges that we might potentially face in doing so, i.e. concerns regarding safe travel for those residing outside the city as well as the possibility of an elevated rate of absenteeism among students, faculty and staff who live a distance from the school. For this reason, a policy change in this regard appears untenable and not in the best interest of the community at large. Although it is important that we strive to maintain continuity of instruction as best we can, the safety and well-being of our community members is of paramount importance.

With this in mind and in recognition of the fact that some of the criteria used by surrounding public school jurisdictions, i.e. the clearing of bus stops, sidewalks, etc., are not always relevant to our community, All Saints Catholic School will implement the following policy change effective with the 2019-2020 academic year.

During the onset of a storm and/or predicted inclement weather, All Saints Catholic School will continue to follow the decisions of Prince William County Public Schools regarding schedule changes.

In the days following the weather event, All Saints Catholic School will make an independent decision. Similarly, the school will also make an independent decision when only severely cold temperatures impact the schedule for Prince William County Public Schools.

All decisions regarding schedule changes, both on those occasions when we follow the county as well as when we make an independent decision, will be announced to the community via SchoolMessenger.

Again, I want to thank you for your thoughtful input on this important question. It has been very helpful hearing from the community and has enabled me to make an informed decision that takes into account the needs and concerns of our families. As always, should you have any questions or wish to discuss, please do not hesitate to let me know.

This week I also wish to share with you two additional staff changes for the upcoming year. Mrs. Feltman (Kindergarten Teacher) has decided to resign from her position at the close of this year to pursue other professional opportunities. Mrs. Feltman has been a wonderful teacher and role model for our young students, providing them an inspiring and nurturing learning environment each day. She will be greatly missed by our community for her kindness and the difference that she has made in the lives of the children.

Mr. Dwane (4th Grade Teacher) has also decided to resign at the end of the year in order to pursue other opportunities. A long-time member of our faculty, Mr. Dwane has been an outstanding example of the faith. Highly regarded by all for his gentle manner,

ready sense of humor and ability to create a caring classroom community, he will be greatly missed.

We give thanks to God for the blessing that Mrs. Feltman and Mr. Dwane have been to our school community and wish them every continued success and blessing in their future endeavors!
