Principal's Message

As announced in the August newsletter, one of the exciting changes at All Saints this year is the implementation of **Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports (PBIS)**, a new approach to classroom management. This week I wish to provide an introduction to PBIS and some of the key details regarding our first year roll-out.

The Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports (PBIS) framework aims to maximize the use of evidence-based prevention and intervention practices along a multi-tiered continuum that supports the academic, social, emotional, spiritual, and behavioral competence of all students.

Together, the All Saints faculty and staff are working to develop a *positive, predictable,* and *safe environment* that will promote strong inter-personal relationships with students and between students through teaching, modeling, and encouragement. Students will be taught to use relevant and expected social skills for themselves and with others. This will create a school climate that is positive, trustworthy, and respectful.

In teaching students expected behaviors, teachers will model or demonstrate the behavior, students will practice the behavior, and teachers will provide feedback. Students will continue to refine the expected behavior over an on-going basis. When multiple attempts at redirecting are not successful, the All Saints faculty and staff have crafted the Student Incident Report which will be part of the multi-tiered "continuum". Parents will be notified through a copy of the Student Incident Report that will be sent home. Together with administration (when necessary), faculty and staff members will implement appropriate supports and disciplinary measures for students.

The following is a brief overview of the three tiers that will be used school-wide.

Tier 1-**Universal Practices**- These are expected of all students in all environments throughout the school. They establish a predictable, consistent, positive, faith-filled and safe school climate.

Tier 2-**Targeted Practices**-These are designed to address student behaviors that need more structure, feedback, instruction, and support than in Tier 1 alone.

Tier 3-Indicated Practices-These are designed to directly address more challenging student behavior than in Tiers 1 and 2.

This research-based program will be further strengthened through the integration of our Catholic identity and commitment to virtue formation, the distinguishing hallmarks of our school.

I want to thank Mrs. Horgan for leading this project and the many teachers who have assisted with the research and planning. Through their efforts and leadership, we will be further transforming the climate and culture of our school as we strive to provide the best formation possible for our students.

The faculty will be meeting on the afternoon of September 27th, our professional development day, to discuss and plan for the next steps. I look forward to providing you periodic updates regarding our efforts and the implementation process. As always, should you have any questions, please do not hesitate to let us know.

Formation in Christian Chastity Program

The safety of your children is always a top priority at All Saints. In accordance with national initiatives and diocesan policy, we have taken additional steps to do our part to ensure that your children are in a safe place when they are participating in a program at All Saints Catholic School. The *Formation in Christian Chastity Program* is one part of our commitment to maintaining a safe environment for our students. As outlined in the online materials, information is provided primarily to parents as a resource to be used in the formation of their children. There is one classroom lesson for students in grades one through four and two lessons for those in grades five through eight.

Each of the lessons contains some application to common sense safety tips that you may wish to share with your children. Other parts of the resources apply to some of the decisions that you make as parents for the safety of your children. Our goal is to equip both you and your children with the knowledge that can help to keep them safe.

The essential point is that parents need to be involved with their children. The more you know about the daily events of your child's life, the better you are able to spot any danger signs that may surface. The more regular communication you have with your children, the freer they are to come to you with their concerns.

Student In-Service ~ Sexual Harassment, Our Policy & Response (Grades 6-8)

In accordance with diocesan policy, students in grades six through eight will participate in a brief classroom presentation within the next three weeks on the topic of the prevention of sexual harassment. Again this year, in consideration of the sensitivity of the topic, the training will be offered in a single-sex environment with Mr. Conroy addressing the boys while Mrs. Horgan will present to the girls. Each of the grade-level lessons will be approximately fifteen minutes in length and include an overview of the diocesan policy as well as an explanation as to how students should respond if they encounter any behaviors of this nature. Background Checks – Policies for School Parent Volunteers

As part of the diocesan initiative to maintain a safe environment for all of our children, all volunteers in the school are required to complete a background check prior to working in the school and to complete VIRTUS training within 45 days of submitting the background check application.

In accordance with diocesan policy, full compliance for an adult parent volunteer is not required for *open* events. (An open event is one that is open to the public, infrequent and publicized, such as Field Day, concerts and special events/assemblies.) However,

full compliance is required for adult parent volunteers who wish to participate in closed events. (A closed event is one that is not entirely open to the general public such as classroom activities, parties, field trips, etc.) For this reason, all parents who wish to attend field trips or volunteer in support of classroom activities are required to complete the background check process and attend VIRTUS training.
