# Principal's Message

Over the course of the past two weeks, we have observed how communities across our country have responded to the tragic death of Mr. George Floyd. For myself, the circumstances have inspired not simply personal reflection but also questions. What can I do to help ensure a just and fair society in which all individuals are treated with care and dignity? And even more importantly, how can I as a school principal ensure that our students become more deeply Catholic in their worldview and committed to living in accord with the message of the Gospel?

A good starting point for responding to these questions can be found in the teachings of our Church. Last week our Superintendent, Dr. Vorbach, shared with school leaders the following call and challenge, citing the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' recent work *Open Wide Our Hearts: The Enduring Call to Love – A Pastoral Letter Against Racism.* 

The *call* is for a "genuine conversion of heart, a conversion that will compel change, and the reform of our institutions and society." The bishops note, "Conversion is a long road to travel for the individual. Moving our nation to a full realization of the promise of liberty, equality, and justice for all is even more challenging. However, in Christ we can find the strength and the grace necessary to make that journey. In this regard, each of us should adopt the words of Pope Francis as our own: let no one 'think that this invitation is not meant for him or her." (p. 7)

The *challenge* pertains to an authentic reflection regarding current practices related to equity, differentiation of learning, student engagement, assessment and social-emotional well-being so that we might consider whether inequities and systemic barriers exist for students in our school. The completion of such an assessment will enable us to pinpoint strategies that might be adopted to address any areas for improvement.

With this in mind, next year I will expand the work of our Multicultural Committee. This is an initiative begun earlier this year to create greater understanding and respect for the diverse cultures within our community. Without question, the year ahead will provide rich opportunities to engage students, faculty and staff in thoughtful dialogue on

this topic.

Throughout my reflections in recent days, I have been drawn time and again to our theme from last year:

The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.

In this moment, I am reminded that our mission is in fact the very formation of our students – heart, mind and soul. As our students go forth and give steady witness to the work of the Holy Spirit in their lives, by God's grace, we will have accomplished a noble purpose that ultimately will help to transform our world.

As we close out an extraordinary year, I wish to convey my sincere gratitude once again for the stellar commitment of our faculty and staff who navigated the transition to eLearning and kept our students on track. I thank all of our school parents for continuing to place their trust in our school and for partnering more closely than ever with us in the formation of their children. I congratulate our students, who though they may not have fully understood the changes taking place around them, adapted to the circumstances and demonstrated a growth mindset as they embraced new ways of learning.

On behalf of our pastor, Fr. Lee Roos, the clergy, faculty and staff, I wish all of you a relaxing and enjoyable summer season. Although our community will be officially on summer break after this week, know that the Task Force will continue with their planning for the new year. Throughout the summer I will provide periodic updates and forward details to you regarding the 2020-2021 academic year as they become available.
