Principal's Message

This week I am pleased to share with you an important update that Dr. Vorbach, Superintendent of Schools, recently communicated to diocesan principals. Recognizing the tremendous efforts of the teachers and the complexity that surrounds this school year, he has decided to implement a "strategic pause" in regards to all *Design for Excellence (DFE)* activity for 2020-2021. He has extended to schools in their self-study year the option of a full year extension from the original date.

I consulted with Fr. Lee regarding this option and we believe that the best course of action for our faculty and staff is to delay the self-study process for one year. As such, our self-study process is now on hold until next fall and we will host a visiting team in the spring of 2022 rather than this coming April as originally scheduled.

I remain grateful to Mrs. Horgan and the members of the Steering Committee who had already begun the process of leading the faculty and staff through the self-study project. While I am confident that they would have been successful in accomplishing this task, I am delighted that we can all defer our efforts until next year so that we can continue to focus on our new instructional plan.

<u>Important Update – School Mass</u>

We are now finalizing a plan for in-person students to regularly attend school Mass. In order to ensure sufficient space for social distancing, we are anticipating that there will be a separate Mass that will take place specifically for our students. This Mass will not be advertised to the general public and attendance will be limited to students, faculty and staff. Students will attend Mass in their "pods" with proper social distancing in place. As it will not be feasible for the entire student body to gather at one time, students will attend Mass approximately every other week. Please note that this will be subject to change due to the scheduling of other liturgical events in our parish such as funerals.
