## Principal's Message

This week I wish to provide an update regarding the continued work of the Task Force. One of the questions that we have recently discussed is that of whether there is a plan to increase the amount of in-person instruction in the near future. On Friday we considered this option, taking into account both the current health data as well as the timing for a potential change. Given the fact that the number of COVID cases are rising in our region and that we are now entering flu/cold season, as well as a time of increased travel and social gatherings related to the holidays, we believe that it remains in the best interest of our school community to continue with our current instructional schedule rather than implement a change at this time. We will continue to monitor circumstances early in the new calendar year and provide updates to you regarding any potential future changes.

The second major discussion topic among the Task Force relates to our preparedness to transition to a 100% virtual model should that become necessary at any point in the year. We remain hopeful that this will not be the case, but want to ensure that our students, faculty and parents are well positioned for such a change. In the event that we need to migrate the entire school to online learning, it is our plan to continue to offer synchronous learning for students. Our ability to do so will be dependent upon each student having access to a device and each family having sufficient bandwidth to meet the needs of both students and parents. In that the school has provided Chromebooks for students in grades 3-8, our question is primarily focused on the needs of families with children in grades K-2. With this in mind, we will be sending a short survey to parents tomorrow so that we can gain a better understanding of any challenges that might exist. In advance, we thank you for your participation in this process which will help us to more effectively prepare a contingency plan.

Yesterday I was delighted to have an opportunity to visit with a number of parents at the Virtual Coffee with the Principal. I received a lot of helpful feedback regarding our current instructional models as well as many thoughtful questions. As a follow up, I want to provide a quick update regarding what appears at times to be a discrepancy between the grades posted in PowerSchool and Schoology. This does, in fact, occur when teachers have input grades in Schoology but not yet "published" and synched them with PowerSchool. For this reason, we encourage parents to track grades via Schoology. This is the platform in which you will find the most up-to-date information regarding your child's academic performance. Current grades can most easily be found by clicking on the "grade report" tab within Schoology.

Much of the discussion during the Coffee focused on the results of the recent parent survey and the initial action plans created by the faculty. I look forward to sharing a summary report with you next week once we have had an opportunity to finalize our plan.

Finally, I wish to share with you a staffing update. Mrs. Lori Odell, our first grade assistant who has been on leave since the start of the school year, has decided to resign from her position. We thank her for her years of dedicated service as a volunteer, substitute teacher and instructional assistant and wish her every continued success and blessing. Mrs. Mia McIntyre, who has been working in the role since August, has graciously accepted the offer to continue her employment as a first grade assistant.
