Principal's Message

This week we congratulate our second grade students as they receive their First Communion during a series of evening liturgies. We pray that this may be a particularly grace-filled time in their lives and that they will each remain close to Jesus now and always.

I am delighted to share with you that on Monday evening we surpassed our fundraising goal of \$20,000 for the *Race for Education*! We are grateful to the many families and friends of All Saints who have so generously supported our cause.

In an effort to sustain the momentum, today we are announcing a "challenge goal" of \$25,000. With students and parents continuing to reach out to relatives and neighbors to ask for their financial support, we know that this new goal is well within our reach.

The "prize cut-off" date remains midnight on May 25. The Awards Assembly will take place at 2:30 p.m. via Zoom on May 27. Again, many thanks to everyone who has helped to make this fundraiser such a success!

Here are some important updates regarding our plan for the Race for Education.

- Students will run the Race by grade level in 45 minute blocks next Wednesday (May 26)
 & Thursday (May 27). For example, 1A and 1B will run at the same time.
- The students will not be required to wear masks while they are running, provided they maintain physical distancing. After completing the run, we will have two separate areas for A/B classes where the students will gather to cool down.
- Since we will not have volunteers assisting with supervision this year, we will shorten the course so that the students remain behind the school rather than running along the side of the building and turning around at the church. The homeroom teachers/assistants will provide supervision on a rotating basis.
- $_{\odot}\mbox{Students}$ are asked to bring and use their own individual water bottles.
- Students will keep track of the laps that they run and record this information in their P.E. logs.
- $_{\circ}$ All of our virtual learners are invited to participate with their classes or they may choose to complete the run at their home.

This week I also wish to share with you several updates regarding our COVID-19 response. In accordance with Governor Northam's Executive Order 72 (seventh amendment), all students, faculty, staff and visitors (regardless of vaccination status) are required to continue wearing masks indoors on campus through the close of the 2020-2021 academic year. I anticipate that additional specific guidance for schools as related to the Executive Orders will be forthcoming this week. As we receive information from the Virginia Council for Private Education (VCPE) and

the diocese, I will continue to update you regarding any changes that may occur prior to the close of the year.

Due to the current restrictions that remain in place, we will not be hosting a school-wide Field Day for students. Instead, Mr. Redman will incorporate some of the traditional games that students enjoy during this annual event in his P.E. classes during the closing weeks of the year.

Task Force Updates

FACTS Enrollment & Tuition Assistance Update

In the days ahead each family will receive an invitation through FACTS to enroll in a payment plan for the 2021-2022 school year. The deadline for payment in full with a 2% discount is June 11. Tuition in full payments may be made directly to the school or through FACTS.

Diocesan allocations for tuition assistance will be confirmed in the weeks ahead. Once we receive this information, we will be able to make final determinations regarding tuition assistance for those families who have applied and will communicate these decisions in June.

• <u>Rising 7th Grade Parents: Reminder of vaccines that are required for entry to 7th</u> grade:

<u>Diphtheria, Tetanus, & Pertussis (DTaP, DTP, or Tdap</u>) Adult Td is required for children 7 years of age and older who do not meet the minimum requirements for tetanus and diphtheria. Effective A booster dose of the Tdap vaccine is required for all children entering the 7th grade. <u>Meningococcal Conjugate (MenACWY) Vaccine</u> - Effective July 1, 2021, a minimum of 2 doses of MenACWY vaccine. The first dose should be administered prior to entering 7th grade. The final

dose should be administered prior to entering 12th grade.

<u>Human Papillomavirus (HPV) Vaccine</u> - Effective July 1, 2021, a complete series of 2 doses of HPV vaccine is required for students entering the 7th grade. The first dose shall be administered before the child enters the 7th grade. After reviewing educational materials approved by the Board of Health, the parent or guardian, at the parent's or guardian's sole discretion, may elect for the child not to receive the HPV vaccine.

• Rising Kindergarten Parents: New Hepatitis A vaccine requirement:

<u>Hepatitis A (HAV) Vaccine</u> – Effective July 1, 2021, a minimum of 2 doses of Hepatitis A vaccine. The first dose should be administered at age 12 months or older.

Medication Pick up for the End of the School Year:

I will be available on June 10th and June 11th for pick up of medications. Please send me an email with your plan. I will be available at any time during those days to meet with you and I can certainly have it ready and leave it at the office for quick pick up. If it would be more convenient for you to pick it up the following week June 14-17th, that is feasible as well. After June 18th, according to the Diocese rules I will have to dispose of all remaining medications. All medication forms and plans for the following school year 2021-2022, are available on the School Nurse Page. New forms are required every year for medications. Please email me with any questions. Thank you for your cooperation.

• Seventh Amendment to Executive Order (EO) 72

As most of you are likely aware, Governor Northam issued another amendment on May 15, 2021. Schools are an exception to this amendment and I have included the exception below. Be aware that more information will be coming regarding mask wearing as we begin the 21-22 school year, likely in July.

School Specific Requirements in EO 72: All students, teachers, staff and visitors must wear a mask over their nose and mouth while indoors (regardless of vaccination status) on all school campuses (public and private) for the remainder of the 2020-2021 school year due to the fact that the majority of students are not yet vaccinated.
