This week I am pleased to provide an update regarding staffing in our school.

Mrs. Melanie Gregory began her employment yesterday as the instructional assistant in the K2 classroom. Mrs. Gregory earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing from George Mason University and worked for a number of years at Reston Hospital Center. A product of Catholic education, she has a great appreciation for the mission of our school. Additionally, as a long-time school parent and volunteer at All Saints, she has a comprehensive understanding of our program and has already established many wonderful relationships with faculty, staff, and parents alike. I also wish to share with you an important update regarding the deferred acceptance program at Seton School, an independent Catholic school in the Diocese of Arlington enrolling students in grades 7-12. For a number of years, Seton has extended to the students of All Saints the option of deferred acceptance. Through this arrangement, students at All Saints who applied for admission to Seton for their 7<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup> grade years have previously had the option of deferring their acceptance until 9<sup>th</sup> grade.

Effective this year, Seton School has made the decision to discontinue the deferred admissions option for all applicants. Starting this fall, students may only apply for admission for the following academic year and may not apply 1-2 years in advance.

Note: The application season for Seton School began on September 1 and will end on January 8, 2022.

All Saints continues to serve as a strong "feeder" school to Seton and we are pleased to maintain a collaborative partnership with the school in support of Catholic education in the Manassas community.

#### **Important Reminders**

#### Formation in Christian Chastity Program

The safety of your children is always a top priority at All Saints. In accordance with national initiatives and diocesan policy, we have taken additional steps to do our part to ensure that your children are in a safe place when they are participating in a program at All Saints Catholic School.

The Formation in Christian Chastity Program is one part of our commitment to maintaining a safe environment for our students. As outlined in the online materials, information is provided primarily to parents as a resource to be used in the formation of their children. There is one classroom lesson for students in grades one through four and two lessons for those in grades five through eight.

We will be integrating the objectives of the program into our religion lessons in the weeks ahead beginning on Monday, September 13. The entire curriculum can be accessed through the diocesan website at the following link:

You are encouraged to spend some time reviewing this information yourself and to then share pertinent aspects with your children. Each of the lessons contains some application to common sense safety tips that you may wish to share with your

children. Other parts of the resources apply to some of the decisions that you make as parents for the safety of your children. Our goal is to equip both you and your children with the knowledge that can help to keep them safe.

The essential point is that parents need to be involved with their children. The more you know about the daily events of your child's life, the better you are able to spot any danger signs that may surface. The more regular communication you have with your children, the freer they are to come to you with their concerns.

Should you have any questions about the *Formation in Christian Chastity Program* or about the classroom lessons, please do not hesitate to let us know. In the event that you would prefer to not have your child participate in the classroom training, please contact the front office to request an opt-out form.

## Background Checks - Policies for School Parent Volunteers

As part of the diocesan initiative to maintain a safe environment for all of our children, all volunteers in the school are required to complete a background check prior to working in the school and to complete VIRTUS training within 45 days of submitting the background check application.

In accordance with diocesan policy, full compliance for an adult parent volunteer is not required for *open* events. (An open event is one that is open to the public, infrequent and publicized, such as Field Day, concerts and special events/assemblies.) However, full compliance is required for adult parent volunteers who wish to participate in closed events. (A closed event is one that is not entirely open to the general public such as classroom activities, parties, field trips, etc.) For this reason, all parents who wish to attend field trips or volunteer in support of classroom activities are required to complete the background check process and attend VIRTUS training.
