## **Principal's Message**

This week I would like to provide an update regarding changes in our faculty and staff for the 2022-2023 academic year.

Miss Anne Kissinger (Pre-Kindergarten Teacher) – Miss Kissinger has determined that she will not be returning in the fall for another year. We thank her for her year of service and for all that she has done to create a joyful environment in her Pre-Kindergarten classroom, most especially as we re-opened the program during the pandemic.

Mrs. Julie Petrisek (Resource Teacher) – As the school year draws to a close, Mrs. Petrisek will be relocating out of the area and for that reason will be resigning in June. For more than two decades, Mrs. Petrisek has been a member of our faculty, first as a part of the team that opened our Pre-Kindergarten program and more recently as a resource teacher. In a particular way, we thank her for all that she has done in support of our students with special learning needs. Through her dedicated approach and attention to details, she has provided support and guidance to students, parents, and faculty alike. Indeed, she has truly made a difference for students who learn differently and who benefit from special assistance.

Mrs. Patrice Snowden (School Nurse) - Mrs. Snowden has decided that this will be her last year in our program. I know that I speak on behalf of our entire community in extending to Mrs. Snowden our great gratitude for all that she has done for our school during the two years of the pandemic. As a member of the Task Force and as our onsite medical professional, she demonstrated extraordinary dedication. She coordinated our school-wide response to COVID cases and provided timely guidance to parents, faculty, and staff, frequently doing so during evening hours and even over the course of weekends and holidays. Her steadfast commitment helped our school navigate the

challenging moments of the pandemic. We thank her for all of these efforts and for all that she continues to do on a daily basis to provide care for our students, faculty, and staff.

On another topic, I would like to provide an update to you regarding our efforts to guide the students toward a "new normal" as circumstances related to the pandemic continue to improve.

During the past two years, mindful of the stress levels of the children and the need to focus on health mitigation strategies, we relaxed some of the expectations related to the school uniform. With the recent changes that have occurred and the decrease in the rate of transmission, we now have the opportunity to shift some of our attention.

Beginning this week, the teachers are providing regular reminders to the students about the uniform, specifically the expectation that they not wear non-uniform apparel in the building and that they strive to wear the uniform properly and proudly. We appreciate your support in this regard as we aim to improve the overall appearance and consistent wearing of our school uniform.

Related to this, the teachers are also encouraging the students to assume greater responsibility for their workspace and classroom. For example, the children will be encouraged to keep their desks clear of any unnecessary items by storing jackets and books in their lockers, cubbies, desks or seat sacks. These best practices will reduce learning distractions and foster good work habits for our students.

In the weeks ahead, the teachers will be reinforcing these expectations and providing gentle reminders to the children in an effort to set them up for success.

I'll continue to keep you updated regarding our efforts to "raise the bar" for our students as we embrace our new normal.
