### DFE Visiting Team Report - Introduction for Operational Vitality Domain

All Saints Catholic School is a beautifully maintained and landscaped pastoral campus that is inviting and bright, reflecting the pride of the maintenance, cleaning, and landscaping crews. The art and school work, hung throughout the building, shows that the faculty, staff, and students also have great pride in their surroundings. A walk through the campus shows that the church and school share an integrated and complementary physical design that evidence a careful stewardship of resources. The Visiting Team supports the goal to implement environmentally sound and green initiatives. A new Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning System (HVAC) is an expense that will need to be addressed in future budgeting.

All Saints Catholic School has a culturally diverse population that is served by a carefully selected and credentialed professional staff. All are focused on providing a nurturing and dynamic learning environment. A full time counselor and a Registered Nurse support the health and emotional needs of the student community. The Visiting Team strongly supports the school's goal to expand the counseling and resource programs to support the changing school population.

All Saints Catholic School provides a competitive, high value option among many different educational alternatives that are available in the local area, including other non-Diocesan Catholic schools. An innovative approach to retaining Middle School students includes a Video Production Program in seventh grade that will lead to student run announcements when students reach eighth grade. Plans to increase revenue by reaching out to donors and alumni are in place. The pandemic caused the closing of the cafeteria and associated reduction of personnel. As the school transitions to a more normal routine, increased staffing should be considered to allow classroom teachers more opportunities for collaboration.

An Enrollment Management Team for marketing and enrollment viability is comprised of church and school personnel. New trends in the diversity and cultural makeup of the parish and school community have been identified and addressed. Grants have been sought and received that focus on the learning needs of this increasingly diverse population. Initiatives are in place to welcome, enroll, and retain Spanish speaking families. including the improvement of parent literacy rates. The mission statement, artwork, and bulletin boards can be found throughout the school in both English and Spanish. Communication to families, including e-mails, website material, and social media are in both English and Spanish.

#### Summer Learning Program

The Summer Learning Program will be emailed to parents and posted on our website on Friday. All assignments and activities will be posted by grade level and available in digital format for ease of access. There will be both reading and math assignments.

In an effort to more effectively target the learning levels of each student, the reading assignments are differentiated by level with corresponding follow up activities. Please see the directions page in the reading folder which explains all assignments.

# Band Program Update (Parents of Rising 4<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> Grade Students)

Instrumental music instruction is available for your son or daughter at All Saints Catholic School. Classes are offered during regular school hours from September – May. The child who learns to play an instrument learns discipline, cooperation with others, and a new way to a fuller, richer life. Playing an instrument places him or her in worthwhile school activities; it gives him something interesting, pleasurable, and worthwhile to do.

The Garwood Whaley Music Program is a local organization closely associated with the Catholic schools which offers contracted music instruction in your school. The fee for instruction includes weekly half-hour lessons during the school day and scheduled on a rotational schedule in order to coordinate with the other subjects, including all concerts or other related functions. Membership in the premier school performing group, the Advanced Band, is based on reliability and instrument achievement during the first school year. There will likely be virtual and in-person concerts, if at all possible, during the school year. The program organizes, again if possible, diocesan-wide events such as an Honor Band and a Band Festival usually held at Bishop Ireton High School.

Our program was selected as the official program of instrumental music instruction in the Diocese of Arlington Schools in 1979. The G.W. Music Program is staffed with qualified full-time and part-time instructors with degrees in music. The program is supervised by Mr. Barry Ward who has taught for 44 years in different schools throughout the diocese and Mr. Ward is presently the Band Director at All Saints, St. Thomas More, St. Bernadette, and St. Leo School.

If you or your child are interested in learning more about the instrumental music program at All Saints, we urge you to attend a meeting to be held at the school in

September. If the interest exists, give your child all possible support and assurance when starting. Take advantage of this opportunity. Enroll your child in the school Band Program.

Instruments that are offered to 4th/5th students (generally first obtained through selected rental program): Flute, Clarinet, Alto Sax, Trumpet, Trombone, and Drums.

Instruments that are also offered to older students (sometimes offered to students, owned by school band program): Bass Clarinet, Tenor Sax, Baritone/Euphonium, and Tuba.
