Safety & Security Updates

The health and safety of the students, faculty, and staff at All Saints has been and continues to be of the highest priority. As a school community, we remain committed to consistently implementing safety protocols and to further enhancing our procedures as informed by best practice.

I am pleased to share that the parish and school have implemented the following security upgrades over the course of the summer.

Video Camera System

Although our school purchased and installed a camera system approximately ten years ago, the newly upgraded system provides much greater capability for our monitoring of

the campus. As part of this project, we replaced all of the original cameras in the school facility and installed additional interior and exterior cameras.

• Electronic Access Controls

The electronic access controls at the front entrance and in the areas adjoining the office lobby have been replaced. Additionally, we are currently installing additional electronic access controls to two exterior doors used by students and staff when accessing the playground and when returning to the school building from outdoor activities.

As in previous years, it will continue to be our practice that all visitors and guests enter the school by way of the main entrance. After an initial screening process conducted by audio/video intercom, parents and visitors who are approved will be invited into the school lobby. Once in the lobby, visitors and guests will be able to communicate with members of the office staff and only granted entrance into the school upon approval from staff.

Interior Gym Doors

A new interior door system is scheduled to be installed this month at the front of the gym which will allow us to better control access to that large gathering space.

These upgrades, as well as the addition of another alarm system in the building, will help us to ensure the safety of our students, faculty, and staff each day.

I wish to thank our pastor, Fr. Lee Roos, and the members of the Parish Safety/Security Committee, for the time and effort that they have invested in these projects which benefit not only the school community but the many programs and ministries that use the school and religious education facility. I also want to thank the parish community for their continued generous support which has enabled us to complete these projects.

Throughout the coming school year, I will periodically provide updates regarding our safety and security plan. Important Reminders

Orientation Day for Students in Grades K-8
Monday, August 21 from 8:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.

Each student will be invited to visit the homeroom classroom accompanied by his/her parents. This will provide each child the opportunity to meet the teacher and to experience the classroom space in advance of the first day of school. Look for an email invitation in the days ahead to sign-up for a specific block of time so that we can provide a personalized orientation experience for you and your family.

Parents who ordered supplies through the school-organized program may pick them up on Orientation Day in the classrooms. All students are asked to come to school prepared with supplies on the first day of classes. On Orientation Day, parents / visitors are invited to park in either the front or rear parking lots.

First Day of School for Grades K-8 Wednesday, August 23

8:00 AM - Morning Bell 8:04 AM - Classes Begin

Since you will already have had the opportunity on Orientation Day to meet the teachers and visit classrooms, parents are asked to drop off their children in the carpool line by 7:58 a.m. Students will enter the building via the breezeway connecting the new facility to the original wing and report directly to their homerooms. The breezeway doors will open at 7:40 a.m. at which time the cars in the front of the carpool line will begin dropping off students at the direction of supervising staff. Any child dropped off before 7:40 a.m. must be escorted by a parent or guardian to the Extended Day Program in Father Kelley Hall.

Dismissal will occur at noon on Wednesday, August 23 for students in grades Kindergarten through eight. Dismissal for grades 1-8 will be at 3:00 p.m. for the remainder of the week. However, the Kindergarten program will dismiss at noon for the first three days of school, August 23-25.

• Dismissal Procedures

Parents will once again be assigned parking areas for afternoon dismissal based upon where their last name occurs in the alphabet. We will continue to use the dismissal process that we implemented three years ago and will provide additional information in advance of the first day of school.

<u>Parking assignments for the new school year will be posted on our school website in</u> the coming weeks.

Parents whose children will be walking to and from school or riding a bicycle are asked to provide written authorization to the office.

Physical & Immunization Requirements

Completion of the <u>Commonwealth of Virginia School Entrance Health Form</u> is required for all Pre-Kindergarten, Kindergarten, 7th Grade, and Transfer students. The Health Form must be completed and on file in our school office prior to the start of the new school year. All other grades may submit the Health Form upon completion of their annual physicals during the school year.

Immunizations required by the Virginia Department of Health can be found on <u>Supplemental Guidance for School Required Vaccines.</u>

Vaccines Required Prior to 7th Grade:

- Meningococcal Conjugate (MenACWY) Vaccine
- Diphtheria, Tetanus, & Pertussis (Tdap)
- Parent's or guardian's may elect for their child not to receive Human Papillomavirus (HPV) Vaccine. A discussion with your child's pediatrician is suggested.

Note: In addition to these immunizations, parents of 7th grade students are asked to submit an updated Health Entrance Form prior to the start of the year.

Kindergarten Vaccine Required Prior to School Entry:

- Hepatitis A

Please be aware that providing documentation of immunization is a necessary condition for enrollment at All Saints. Those students who have not received proper immunization will not be permitted to attend school.

Background Checks – Policies for Parent Volunteers

As part of the diocesan initiative to maintain a safe environment for all of our children, all volunteers in the school are required to complete a background check prior to working in the school and to complete VIRTUS training within 45 days of submitting the background check application.

In accordance with diocesan policy, full compliance for an adult parent volunteer is not required for *open* events. (An open event is one that is open to the public, infrequent and publicized, such as Field Day, concerts and special events/assemblies.) However, full compliance is required for adult parent volunteers who wish to participate in closed events. (A closed event is one that is not entirely open to the general public such as classroom activities, parties, field trips, etc.) For this reason, all parents who wish to attend field trips or volunteer in support of classroom activities are required to complete the background check process and attend VIRTUS training.

Please note that this applies to prior year volunteers, including those who visited the school during the spring months of the past academic year.

Information for Pre-Kindergarten Families

All Pre-Kindergarten parents and students are invited to visit the classrooms during Pre-Kindergarten Orientation on Thursday, August 24 from 8:00 - 11:00 a.m. and 12:00 - 2:00 p.m. An email with instructions for signing-up for a specific time slot will be sent to Pre-K parents this week.

The first day for the Pre-Kindergarten will be Monday, August 28 with dismissal at noon for the first week.

Pre-Kindergarten parents are reminded that, beginning this year, students in the program will wear a uniform each day. While similar to that worn by students in grades K-8, the Pre-K uniform has been designed to help our youngest learners look distinct while still being easily recognized as students of All Saints Catholic School.
