#### **Principal's Message**

The opening weeks of the school year have been a great success, with students learning classroom and school-wide procedures and committing to strong work habits for the year ahead. I am proud of their enthusiastic efforts and grateful to the teachers who continue to foster an environment of high expectations for all of our students.

Next week students in grades 3-7 will begin their first round of standardized testing through NWEA-MAP, an assessment that our school will complete by Friday, September 29. As an adaptive online assessment, the MAP test pinpoints each student's learning level in reading, language arts, and math. As students complete the second and third rounds of testing over the course of the year, the teachers will be able to closely track their progress and plan instruction based upon the needs of each classroom of learners.

The teachers will be posting the dates and times of their classroom testing sessions. In support of your child/ren's success on their assigned days of MAP testing, please ensure that they report to school on time. Additionally, they will be better able to perform to the best of their ability if they are well-rested and have enjoyed a healthy and nutritious breakfast.

Secondly, this week I wish to share a couple of important health related updates.

#### **Diocese of Arlington COVID-19 Policy**

On May 11, 2023, the federal COVID-19 public health emergency ended. In turn, the Virginia Department of Health (VDH) retired its Interim Guidance for COVID-19 Prevention for Students, Teachers and Staff in Child Care, K-12 Schools, and Day Camp Settings and replaced it with a referral to the Centers for Disease Control's guidance.

In response to these new circumstances, the Diocese of Arlington and its parishes and schools will respond to COVID-19 under our general sick leave policy, with the addition of the COVID-19 guidance provided by the VDH. This guidance will apply to students and staff in all diocesan entities, including parishes without a diocesan school as well as the Central Administrative Office and its satellite locations.

Our general sick leave policy for students and staff is as follows:

- Those who are ill or have symptoms of illness should remain home until symptoms are improved and the individual is fever free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication.
- Per the VDH, those who are formally diagnosed with COVID-19, either by test (including home testing) and/or healthcare provider, will follow the CDC guidance found here: <a href="https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/your-health/isolation.html">https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/your-health/isolation.html</a> or the direction of the individual's licensed healthcare provider.
- Those who are formally diagnosed by a healthcare provider with an infectious disease other than COVID-19 will follow the written direction of their healthcare provider.

## **Meningococcal Vaccine**

The Virginia Department of Health is responding to a statewide outbreak of meningococcal disease caused by the bacterium *Neisseria meningitidis* serogroup Y. The first case was detected in June 2022, and the outbreak was declared in the eastern region in September 2022. The same strain has since been identified in the southwest and central regions of Virginia.

The majority of case-patients (18) developed septicemia, and not meningitis, with common symptoms including fever, nausea, vomiting, and muscle aches. Please use the links below for additional information:

The meningococcal conjugate vaccine (MenACWY) can provide protection against *Neisseria meningitidis* serogroup Y. VDH encourages parents and school nurses to ensure adolescents and teens receive the meningococcal conjugate vaccine on schedule upon entry into 7<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grades. Contact your <u>local health department</u> if you have questions about your options for accessing the MenACWY vaccine.

While this communication from the State of Virginia is not cause for alarm, it does provide important information for parents to be aware of in ensuring the health of their children.

#### School Safety Update

I'm pleased to confirm that the new doors at the entrance to the gym/cafeteria were installed last week. This facility enhancement will provide us greater opportunity to secure the gym/cafeteria, particularly in the event of a safety related concern. Again, I wish to thank the Parish Safety & Security Committee for their involvement in this project and the parish for their generous support of this initiative.

#### Background Checks – Policies for School Parent Volunteers

As part of the diocesan initiative to maintain a safe environment for all of our children, all volunteers in the school are required to complete a background check prior to working in the school and to complete VIRTUS training within 45 days of submitting the background check application.

In accordance with diocesan policy, full compliance for an adult parent volunteer is not required for *open* events. (An open event is one that is open to the public, infrequent and publicized, such as Field Day, concerts and special events/assemblies.) However, full compliance is required for adult parent volunteers who wish to participate in closed events. (A closed event is one that is not entirely open to the general public such as classroom activities, parties, field trips, etc.) For this reason, all parents who wish to attend field trips or volunteer in support of classroom activities are required to complete the background check process and attend VIRTUS training.
