Principal's Message

This week I am pleased to share with you that the 4th grade at All Saints has been selected to represent private schools across the nation by participating in the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) on Tuesday, January 30. NAEP is the largest nationally representative and continuing assessment of what students in public and private schools know and can do in various subjects. NAEP is different from state and school assessments because it provides a common measure of student achievement across the country. It is administered by the National Center for Education Statistics, within the U.S. Department of Education. The results are released as The Nation's Report Card, which provides information about student achievement to educators, parents/guardians, policymakers, and the public. By this time, parents of 4th grade students should have received a letter regarding this program. Should you have any questions about the assessment or your child's participation, please do not hesitate to contact Miss Mallon for more information.

Last week, I had the opportunity to attend a half day retreat with colleagues from the diocese as part of a Professional Learning Community (PLC) on the topic of inclusion for students with special needs. That experience, as well as the other online meetings taking place over the course of the school year, was informative and inspiring, providing an in-depth introduction to innovative strategies designed to make Catholic education more inclusive for students with distinct learning needs. So many of the structures and methodologies, such as *Universal Design for Learning*, can benefit the wide range of student abilities in a typical classroom in this post-pandemic era. As our teachers continue to participate in training on the topic of PLCs, these ideas will undoubtedly enrich the robust conversations already surrounding the topic of teaching and learning at All Saints. I look forward to providing periodic updates as we continue to discuss how we can best meet the needs of all of the students entrusted to our care as we plan for the spring and the upcoming school year.

Related to this topic, Porto Charities is sponsoring an upcoming conference entitled *From Inclusion to Belonging* on February 17 at St. John Paul the Great High School. During the keynote presentation and breakout sessions, families and individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities will learn

practical ways to identify and utilize support systems within the local community to help them overcome mental health struggles. For more information and details regarding registration, please see the link below.



Uniform Reminders

As we head into the second half of the year, this is a good opportunity to review the uniform guidelines. Please ensure that students are looking their best by having the young men wear belts (K-8) and button their shirts all the way to the top when wearing a tie. We also ask that their hair be above their ears, collar, and eyebrows. For the young ladies, please make sure that headbands and hair ties match the

uniform and, as reminder, bracelets, necklaces, make up, nail polish (other than clear) and fake nails are never permitted.

As a reminder, all students should be in solid, black athletic shoes without any other colors. Lastly, as we look to strengthening our adherence to the policy, please note that P.E. sweatshirts are no longer allowed to be worn with the regular uniform. Rather, all students must be in their sweater for the winter uniform, per the dress code, and are allowed to wear the sweater at other times, if needed, for an additional layer. The All Saints sweatshirt is only to be worn for P.E. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation. In January we provided a copy of the *Continuous Enrollment Contract* to parents of students completing their first year of enrollment at All Saints. Through completion of this form, parents may continuously enroll their child/ren through 8th grade from All Saints or, if necessary, until such time that they complete the withdrawal process. With submission of this contract, there is no need for future completion of an annual re-registration form.

The Continuous Enrollment Fee, formerly known as the Re-Registration Fee, will automatically be billed through FACTS accounts on March 1, 2024. The completion of the contract and payment of the fee will confirm enrollment for your child/ren for the upcoming school year.
