### Principal's Message

Earlier this week the Parish Finance Council met to review and discuss the school budget for the 2024-2025 academic year. With the unanimous recommendation of the Council, Father Lee has approved a budget that reflects a continued commitment to increasing the level of compensation for our teachers and staff.

For the upcoming school year, tuition for both the Pre-Kindergarten and K-8 programs will increase 3%. This increase will allow us to not only sustain and grow our programs, but also support a salary increase for our faculty and staff who demonstrate great dedication to the mission of our school.

We are thankful for the continued support of our parish which contributes a significant annual investment to help finance the operations of the school, allowing for tuition rates that are lower than the actual cost of educating a child in our program. Additionally, our ability to provide more than \$330,000 in tuition assistance continues to ensure that families in our community are able to give their children the gift of a Catholic education regardless of financial considerations. We are grateful to our parish and diocese as well as the many donors who support this effort through their contributions to the Scholarship Foundation Fund and other programs.

As we celebrate Catholic Schools Week, it is a time during which we recognize the gift of Catholic education, one from which our students benefit so greatly. As they live and share the message of the Gospel over the course of weeks, months, and years, it becomes ever more a part of the fabric of their lives, providing a foundation for all of their future years.

One of the cornerstones of Catholic education is a commitment to excellence in all things. And one of the ways that we strive to maintain such an environment is by regularly seeking your feedback regarding your level of satisfaction with your experience of our school. With this in mind, tomorrow we will forward to parents the annual parent satisfaction survey. The instrument that we use for this process is

the *Net Promoter Survey*, a two question methodology that allows us to measure performance over time while also providing parents an opportunity to offer a detailed narrative response. In advance, we thank you for your participation in this process which helps us ensure that our goals are aligned to the needs of our students and the perceptions of parents in our school community.

On this occasion of Catholic Schools Week, I wish to acknowledge and thank the faculty and staff for all that they do each day to support our mission and to meet the needs of the children entrusted to our care. Just two days ago, Dr. Leslie Lipovski (Assistant Superintendent) visited our school and had the opportunity to interact with teachers and students in our classrooms. She commented that she could not help but notice how welcoming and happy the children were in their learning environment. I thank the faculty and staff for creating such an intentional space, one in which faith, joy, and a high level of care are a lived and shared experience for our students each day.

I also wish to thank our parent community, particularly the PTO, for partnering so closely with us and for supporting our efforts to create such a wonderful environment for our students and families. The success of the Bingo Night on Saturday evening, the largest ever turnout for this event, was yet another example of the great sense of community that surrounds our school. Many thanks to Mrs. Kelly Ballard and her team of volunteers for planning such a terrific event.

Finally, I want to congratulate the students in our 2<sup>nd</sup> grade class who received their First Reconciliation on Saturday. We are so very proud of them and assure them of our prayers as they continue to prepare for their First Communion in May.

#### Uniform Reminders

As we head into the second half of the year, this is a good opportunity to review the uniform guidelines. Please ensure that students are looking their best by having the young men wear belts (K-8) and button their shirts all the way to the top when wearing a tie. We also ask that

their hair be above their ears, collar, and eyebrows. For the young ladies, please make sure that headbands and hair ties match the uniform and, as reminder, bracelets, necklaces, make up, nail polish (other than clear) and fake nails are never permitted.

As a reminder, all students should be in solid, black athletic shoes without any other colors. Lastly, as we look to strengthening our adherence to the policy, please note that P.E. sweatshirts are no longer allowed to be worn with the regular uniform. Rather, all students must be in their sweater for the winter uniform, per the dress code, and are allowed to wear the sweater at other times, if needed, for an additional layer. The All Saints sweatshirt is only to be worn for P.E. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation. ### Parking Reminder – After School Activities

Parents picking their children up following after school activities are reminded to park in front of the church and to walk to the courtyard where the students gather for dismissal. As the driveway adjacent to the courtyard and the front of the school is a designated fire lane, parents are asked not to park their vehicles or form a car line in this area.

In January, we will provide a copy of the *Continuous Enrollment Contract* to parents of students completing their first year of enrollment at All Saints. Through completion of this form, parents may continuously enroll their child/ren through 8<sup>th</sup> grade from All Saints or, if necessary, until such time that they complete the withdrawal process. With submission of this contract, there is no need for future completion of an annual re-registration form.

The Continuous Enrollment Fee, formerly known as the Re-Registration Fee, will automatically be billed through FACTS accounts on March 1, 2024. The completion of the contract and payment of the fee will confirm enrollment for your child/ren for the upcoming school year.
