Reading Challenge Game Board!
(Reading Skills for Summer)

On the following link, you'll find [a game board](#). There are 19 blocks on this board. We challenge you to read for 19 days this summer! Aim for 5-20 minutes per day. On each section of the board, you'll find a task. Please use the guide below to determine what to do in each section. If you make it all the way to the finish line, be sure to let your teacher know on the first day of school!

Game Board Section	Instructions
Read 20 min	Read for 20 minutes
Vocabulary word	Take notice of a new vocabulary word. Try to figure out what it means.
Read a poem	Find a poem and read it to yourself and aloud to a family member.
Infer	Make an inference. Use what is stated in the text with what you already know to gather even more information.
Retell	Tell someone what happened in your story. Use words like: first, next, last, beginning, middle, end...
Predict	Make a prediction and check to see if it was accurate.
Wonder	Think about something in the text that the author hasn't told you much about.
Fluency	Read smoothly and accurately. No robot reading!
