Principal's Message

During Catholic Schools Week, we invited parents to participate in the annual *Parent Satisfaction Survey*. I am grateful to the 145 parents who responded to the survey question, many of whom provided detailed feedback regarding their perception of existing strengths in our program as well as areas for continued growth.

Survey Summary

Last week we shared the survey results with our teachers who will be meeting in their instructional teams to discuss the areas identified by parents for further improvement. It is my hope that through a consensus-building process, we will be able to identify a few "quick fixes" as well as some strategies in support of more substantive improvement in specific areas. I look forward to providing further updates as we work through this process.

I would be remiss if I didn't take a moment to acknowledge the great work and dedication of our faculty and staff which was so clearly reflected in the feedback provided by parents. We are blessed with teachers who demonstrate a tremendous level of care and concern for their students and a desire to grow in their practice so as to provide the best learning environment possible for the children. In an effort to retain these teachers, we have implemented several strategies during the 2024-2025 school year.

With the support of the Parish Finance Council and the approval of our pastor, Fr. Lee, we have a designed a budget for the upcoming school year that allows us to compensate our teachers at the rate of 80% of the Prince William County Public School pay scale for the current year. This has been a goal for our school and I am pleased that, in addition to providing our faculty with a 5% increase for the upcoming year, we have been able to invest the funds needed to close the gap in support of this goal.

Secondly, we recognize that providing opportunities for professional growth, collaboration, and support for one another as a teaching community is essential. To this end, we restructured the master schedule this year to provide even more opportunities for shared planning times for teachers. This effort, combined with the implementation of Professional Learning Communities, has increased the time allotted for instructional planning and made the conversations among teachers even more targeted and robust.

For those teachers who are new to the profession, I am pleased that a number have completed coursework through a partnership between the Office of Catholic Schools and Trinity University – all at no cost to our teachers, thanks in part to our access to Title II funding.

It is my hope that these efforts communicate to our teachers that they are part of a school community in which they are truly valued and affirmed for all that they do and supported and encouraged as they continue to grow as professional educators.

I would also like to take a moment to provide a little insight on the topic of discipline in our school. Over the past couple of years, recognizing that the social-emotional needs of students in the post-pandemic era are greater than ever, we have intentionally continued to reteach and model basic expectations and behaviors. The efforts of the *Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports* (PBIS) Committee as well as the training that all teachers received in August on the topic of *Conscious Classroom Management* have positively helped to shape the culture of our school. And while there remains more work to do in this area in the long-run, the fact that fewer survey respondents referenced a concern related to discipline is an indicator that we are moving in the right direction. Again, my thanks to the faculty and staff who each day teach and model behavioral expectations for our students, always anchoring the effort in the importance of kindness and respect.

Again, thank you for your participation in this annual process. We so appreciate the opportunity to hear from you and to receive your feedback as we plan for the year ahead.

Important Reminders

• Bread of Life Food Drive

During this Lenten season, we are pleased to host the All Saints' **Bread of Life Food Drive** to benefit the Bethany Food Pantry and St. Lucy Project from March 4 – 15, 2024. In 1992, the University of Notre Dame Club of Staten Island launched this community service initiative and it has since spread to communities around the country. All Saints' Bread of Life Food Drive will assist individuals and families in our local community in need of food assistance. Please see details below regarding our 2024 food drive:

When will the food drive take place?

All Saints Bread of Life Food Drive will run from **Monday, March 4 – Friday, March 15**, **2024**. All Saints students from the National Junior Honor Society (NJHS) will help organize and promote the drive. Members of our seventh grade video production class are assisting with the creation of video promos to encourage participation throughout the week.

Where does the food go?

Almost a quarter of a million people in the Arlington Diocese are "food insecure,"

meaning they do not know where their next meal will come from. Our school's Bread of Life Food Drive will benefit the St. Lucy Project and All Saints' Bethany Food Pantry to assist families and individuals living within Manassas, Manassas Park, and Prince William County.

What can you do to help?

During the drive from March 4-15, your child can bring in food donations in the morning and leave them in the boxes that will be outside of each classroom. Donations can also be brought to the All Saints school office (Monday - Thursday) between the hours of 8:00 AM-3:30 PM.

What food should I donate to All Saints Bread of Life Food Drive?

• Lenten Rice Lunch – Friday, <u>March</u> 22

As we approach the conclusion of Lent, we want to thank you for encouraging your children to participate in the CRS Rice Bowl project. This initiative has provided our students a very specific way to embrace the practice of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving during this liturgical season.

In support of the effort, on Friday, March 22nd, the cafeteria will host a simple lunch, the proceeds of which will benefit the Rice Bowl project. As a sign of our solidarity with the poor around the world and in an effort to help the students gain a better understanding of poverty, the lunch will consist of one bowl of rice and water. This will be the only food and drink available for purchase on that day. Although participation is

completely voluntary, we are hopeful that many of the children will embrace this opportunity and recognize it as a chance to increase their empathy for those suffering in our world.

The cost of the lunch is \$5.00 and should be submitted as a cash donation rather than through the online lunch accounts. Students may bring a lunch from home if they prefer and are reminded to bring a drink if they so choose as only water will be available in the cafeteria.
