Principal's Message:

On Monday evening, the Parish Finance Council met to review and discuss the school budget for the 2025-2026 academic year. With the unanimous recommendation of the Council, Monsignor Lee has approved a budget that reflects a continued commitment to increasing the level of compensation for our teachers and staff.

For the upcoming school year, tuition for both the Pre-Kindergarten and K-8 programs will increase 3%. This increase will allow us to not only sustain and grow our programs, but also support a salary increase for our faculty and staff who demonstrate great dedication to the mission of our school.

We are thankful for the continued support of our parish which contributes a significant annual investment to help finance the operations of the school, allowing for tuition rates that are lower than the actual cost of educating a child in our program. Additionally, our ability to provide more than \$300,000 in tuition assistance continues to ensure that families in our community are able to give their children the gift of a Catholic education regardless of financial considerations. We are grateful to our parish and diocese as well as to the many donors who support this effort through their contributions to the Scholarship Foundation Fund and other programs.

On this occasion of Catholic Schools Week, I wish to acknowledge and thank the faculty and staff for all that they do each day to support our mission and to meet the needs of the children entrusted to our care. They are a remarkable group of professionals who bring enthusiasm and joy to their work each day, creating an engaging, nurturing, and supportive environment for our students. I could not be more proud of their efforts and outstanding teamwork!

I also wish to thank our parent community, particularly the PTO, for partnering so closely with us and for supporting our efforts. With events, such as the Bingo Night on Saturday evening, and the surprise delivery of bakery treats to our faculty and staff on Monday morning, they support and encourage our faculty, staff, and students through thoughtful initiatives and activities. Many thanks to Mrs. Kelly Ballard, PTO President, and the entire Executive Committee for all that they do for our school.

In closing, I want to congratulate the students in our 2nd grade class who received their First Reconciliation on Saturday. We are so very proud of them and assure them of our prayers as they continue to prepare for their First Communion in May.

On behalf of our pastor, Monsignor Lee Roos, the clergy, faculty, and staff, thank you for choosing All Saints Catholic School for your family. Happy Catholic Schools Week!
