Principal's Message:

The new school year is off to a wonderful start, with students quickly learning procedures and striving to do their best each day. I am very proud of them for the way that they have quickly settled into the routine and for so closely following the guidance and direction of their teachers. Just by way of example, their participation in the first emergency drills of this year was simply outstanding. I want to thank the teachers and staff for all that they are doing to create caring relationships in their classrooms and for modeling a commitment to excellence for their students. Although we haven't yet reached "cruising altitude" for this year, the take-off has been wonderful and I look forward to the great things that our students and teachers will accomplish in the months ahead.

An aspect of the start of the school year is the opportunity to clarify and give particular emphasis to policies and procedures that help us maintain a safe, predictable, and orderly environment for our students. Here are a couple of reminders as we continue to establish routines for the year.

1.) Uniform Clarification

In accordance with the *Parent-Student Handbook*, girls with pierced ears may wear one pair of stud earrings in their earlobe only. No dangling earrings or hoops, even small, are permitted. Necklaces, bracelets, and rings of any kind are not permitted as these can present a safety concern during recess and PE.

Effective this academic year, we wish to clarify that students may wear religious medals, necklaces, and scapulars, provided they are worn under the uniform. This will ensure student safety during P.E. and recess and also help us to maintain a uniform appearance among our students. We recognize that allowing students to wear religious medals is important for many of our families and we are pleased to offer this clarification which will be reflected in the 2026-2027 edition of our handbook.

2.) Dismissal Reminder – Signing out a Student at the Office

In accordance with the handbook, parents who need to sign-out their child prior to the close of the school day are asked to do so by 2:45 p.m., the time at which office personnel begin to prepare for the dismissal of school.

Parents are discouraged from signing-out their children after 2:45 p.m. except in the event of an emergency. While we understand that occasional appointments and/or emergencies may arise, regular signing out of a child, especially close to dismissal, creates disruptions to our school environment. If you have a special circumstance that requires consideration, please contact the administration in advance so that we can work together to find an appropriate solution.

NWEA MAP Testing Reminder

Next week students in grades 3-7 will begin their first round of standardized testing through NWEA-MAP, an assessment that our school will complete by Friday, September 26. As an adaptive online assessment, the MAP test pinpoints each student's instructional level in reading, language arts, and math. As students prepare for the second and third rounds of testing over the course of the year, the teachers will be able to closely track their progress and plan instruction based upon the needs of each classroom of learners.

The teachers will post the dates and times of their classroom testing sessions. In support of your child/ren's success on assigned days of MAP testing, please ensure that they report to school on time. Additionally, they will be better able to perform to the best of their ability if they are well rested and have enjoyed a healthy and nutritious breakfast.

We look forward to completing this first round of testing with our students and setting instructional goals for the year ahead. Should you have any questions about MAP testing, please do not hesitate to let us know.

Student In-Service ~ Sexual Harassment, Our Policy & Response (Grades 6-8)

In accordance with diocesan policy, students in grades six through eight will participate in a brief classroom presentation within the next three weeks on the topic of the prevention of sexual harassment. Again this year, in consideration of the sensitivity of the topic, the training will be

offered in a single-sex environment with Mr. Conroy addressing the boys while Ms. Mallon will present to the girls. Each of the grade-level lessons will be approximately fifteen minutes in length and include an overview of the diocesan policy as well as an explanation as to how students should respond if they encounter any behaviors of this nature. • Background Checks – Policies for School Parent Volunteers

As part of the diocesan initiative to maintain a safe environment for all of our children, all volunteers in the school are required to complete a background check prior to working in the school and to complete VIRTUS training within 45 days after their application has been approved.

In accordance with diocesan policy, full compliance for an adult parent volunteer is not required for open events. (An open event is one that is open to the public, infrequent and publicized, such as Field Day, concerts, and special events/assemblies.) However, full compliance is required for adult parent volunteers who wish to participate in closed events. (A closed event is one that is not entirely open to the general public such as classroom activities, parties, field trips, etc.) For this reason, all parents who wish to attend field trips or volunteer in support of classroom activities are required to complete the background check process and attend VIRTUS training.

VIRTUS trainings are held throughout the year at parishes and schools throughout the diocese and are free of charge to all participants. An email is generated to register for the training once an individual has completed the online criminal background check application and it has been approved by Mrs. Diana Neri, our parish and school liaison. Individuals are required by Diocesan policy to complete this adult safe environment training within 45 days after their application has been approved.


